Local educators receive scholarships to support advancement of trauma sensitive practices in schools.

Lynchburg, **VA** – Horizon Behavioral Health is offering five scholarships to local educators and school administrators to attend the National Creating Trauma Sensitive Schools Conference in Houston, TX on February 20-21, 2023.
