'Hidden In Plain Sight' community workshops to educate parents and caregivers on fentanyl risks

Lynchburg, VA – According to a recent study, an average of 22 high-school aged youth died each week in the U.S. from drug overdoses in 2022, a record number driven primarily by fentanyl poisonings from counterfeit pills (NEJM, 2024).

Horizon Behavioral Health seeks to prepare and protect residents of Central Virginia by offering a *Hidden In Plain Sight* Workshop Series for parents and caregivers, in partnership with local law enforcement. The immersive workshop experience will simulate a mock teens' bedroom designed to give parents, teachers, coaches, and other caring adults, the skills needed to recognize and address risky behaviors in young people. The interactive presentation will address the latest drug trends, including how to recognize items that may be contaminated with fentanyl, common items found in a teens' room that may indicate risky behaviors, signs of mental health challenges, technology risks, available resources, and how to get help. Participants will also have the opportunity to be trained in emergency opioid overdose response and receive free resources to safeguard their and their loved ones.
